


REDISCOVERING DOWNTOWNRECONNECTING, RECHARGING, AND RECONVENING IN THE CITY

Released this summer, the Rediscover Downtown Dayton Action Plan is the result of nearly 100 community leaders, business owners, residents, and stakeholders committed to downtown's continued growth and recovery who gathered to address some of the top challenges and opportunities the COVID-19 pandemic presented for downtown Dayton.

The plan was created at this pivotal moment to provide a **blueprint for downtown's recovery after the pandemic**, but also to capitalize on the opportunities for funding and development, and to leverage the public's energy to rediscover downtown coming out of the shutdown.

The plan includes summaries and recommendations from subcommittees focused on eight different priority sectors:

DOWNTOWN PROGRESS CONTINUES: SECOND OUARTER **INVESTMENT HIGHLIGHTS**



At the **Dayton Arcade**, The Contemporary Dayton welcomed visitors to the inaugural exhibits in the gallery's new home, while residents began moving into the new Arts Lofts apartments. New events in the rotunda included a monthly market, weddings, and other happenings. Planning also was underway for the Arcade's public grand opening events which took place in early August.

The **Fire Blocks** residential units are now completely full, and new commercial tenants include Ascend Innovations and the Greater Dayton Area Hospital Association, new restaurant Jollity, and new business Two Social (opening soon). Additionally, the Home Telephone – Journal Herald Building project was awarded \$1.2 million in Ohio Historic Preservation Tax Credits.

Construction began on **The Sutton**, a new five-story apartment building at 307 E. First St. from Crawford Hoying and Woodard Development, who also currently are constructing **The Monument** apartments across from RiverScape MetroPark.

Taft Dayton announced it will expand its office footprint by 25% after it signed a 15-year lease to take up several floors of the Stratacache Tower and open a 3,900-square-foot Taft Center on the first floor for meetings, conferences and events.



Weyland Ventures opened a coworking business called **Genuine** Work in the Motor Car Building at 15 McDonough St. as part of its development in the Oregon East district.

Office tower owners continued to make major investments and improvements, including lobby upgrades, remodeled office spaces, and new amenities. The DDP video series "Elevate" released a new video on Talbott Tower in the second quarter.

Link: Dayton Bike Share expanded its network with the launch of seven new bike hubs in May.

Key pedestrian **crosswalks** throughout downtown Dayton have been improved, including pedestrian refuge islands and curb extensions, upgrading signing and pavement markings, replacing curb ramps, and upgrading pedestrian signals.

The reconstructed, 440-foot long **Deeds Point Pedestrian Bridge** that connects RiverScape MetroPark to Deeds Point park opened in the second quarter.

RETAIL LAB SPRING COHORT COMPLETES WORKSHOP SERIES

The Downtown Dayton Retail Lab is an intensive 12-week experience for business owners aiming to launch or grow their first-floor business in downtown Dayton. In the second quarter, the Spring 2021 Retail Lab participants completed their workshop series and transitioned to working with service providers to implement their business improvement projects. This cohort has nine businesses, including five minority-owned and seven women-owned businesses. They will present their progress at a Demo Day event in August. Selection of the Fall 2021 cohort takes place in July.



NEW INITIATIVE AIMS TO IDENTIFY PLACEMAKING PROJECTS FOR DOWNTOWN ACTIVATION

In the second quarter, the Downtown Dayton Partnership launched a new initiative called **Place Lab**. The Place Lab is an approach to prioritizing and implementing lean, creative, tactical placemaking projects designed to make downtown places more vibrant, inclusive, engaging, and connected. For 2021, the focus will be on projects that support COVID-19 relief and downtown reopening efforts to help businesses enhance street-level activation.
