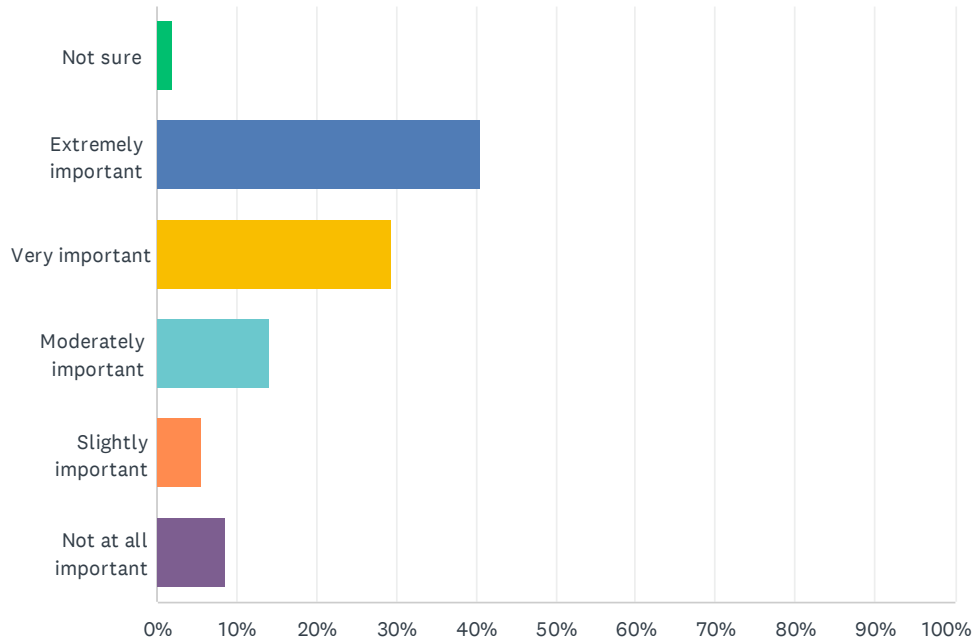


## Q1 How important is it to you that the permanent memorial be located on Fifth Street in the Oregon District?

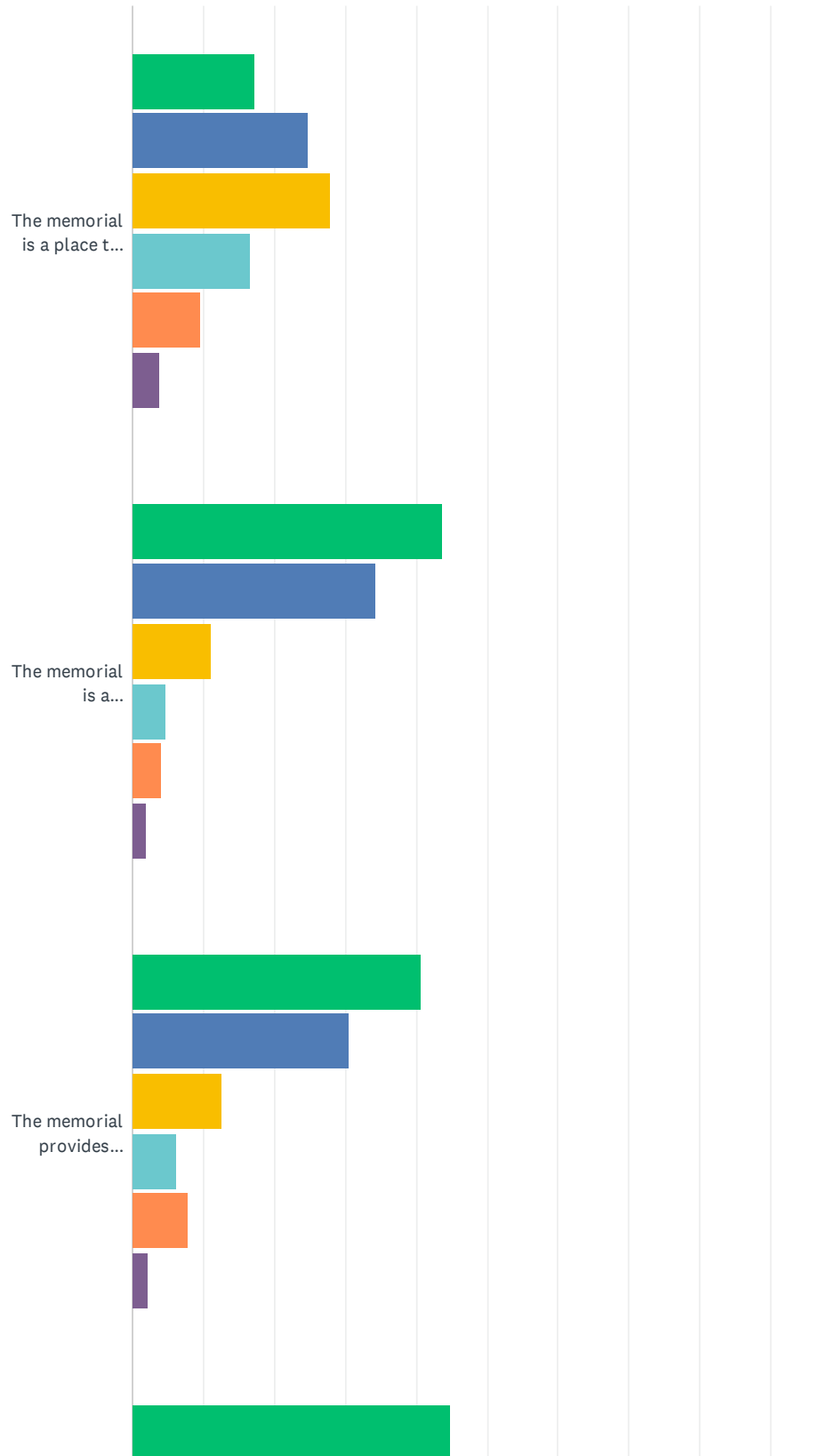

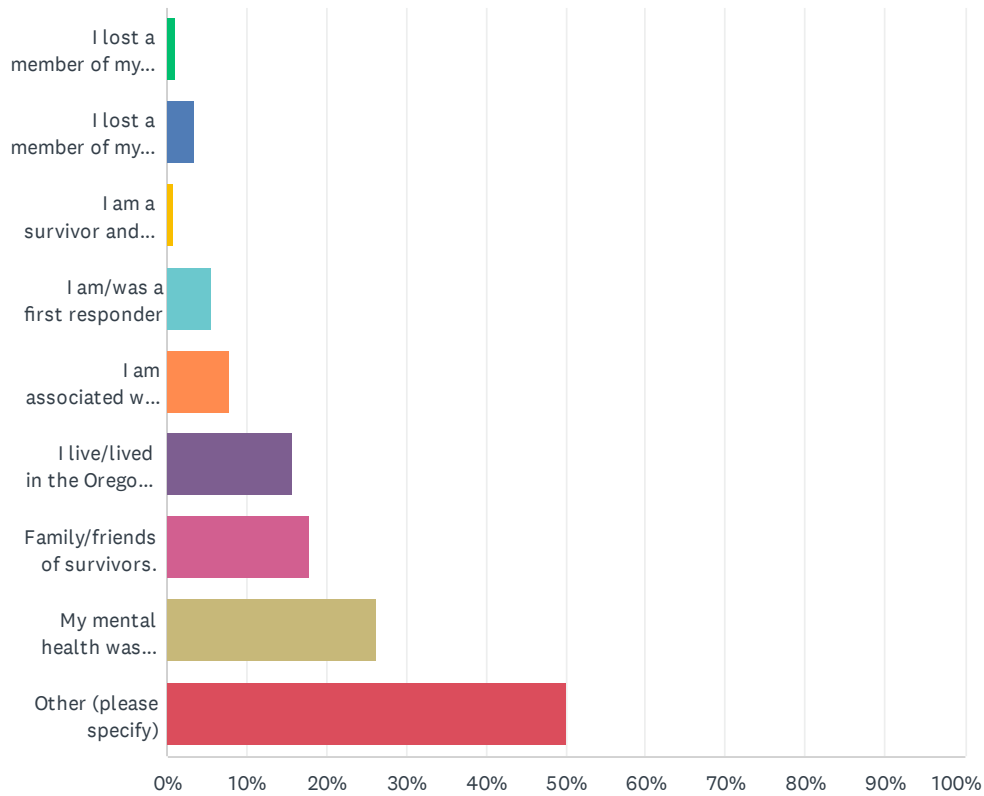
Q6 In a single word, describe the most important aspect for the memorial.

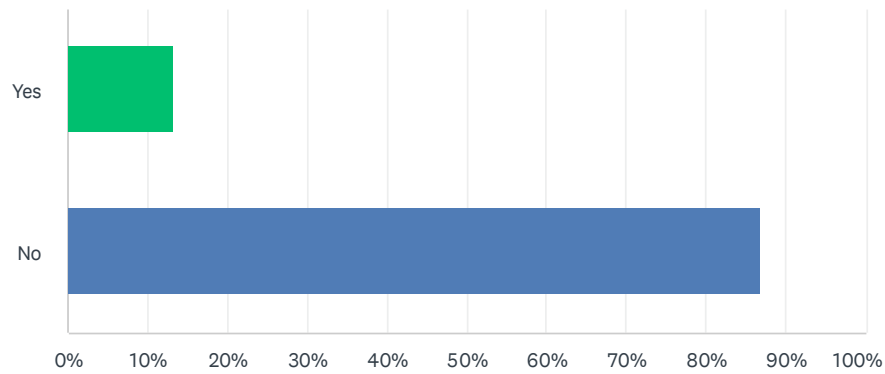

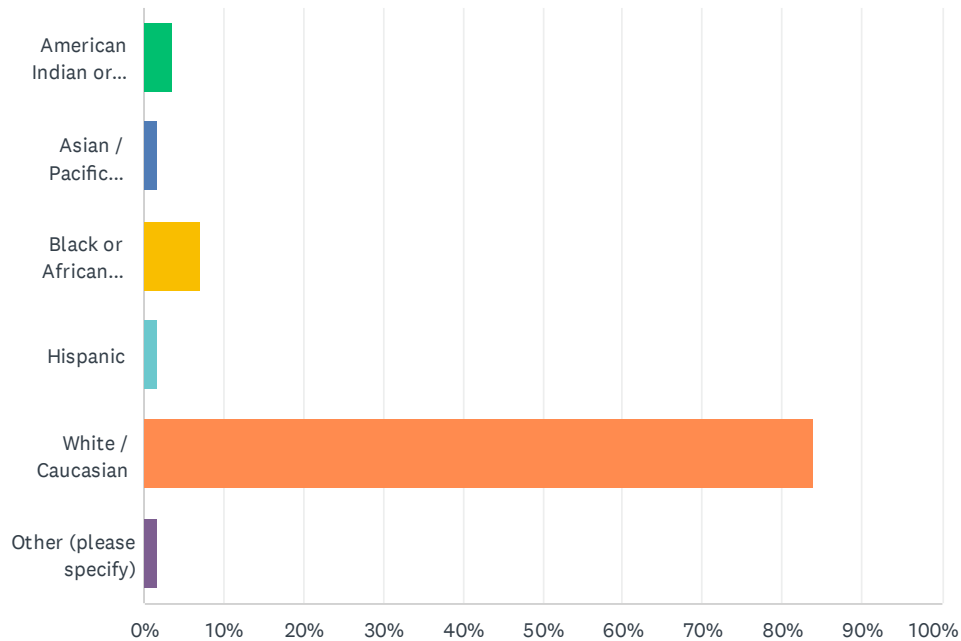

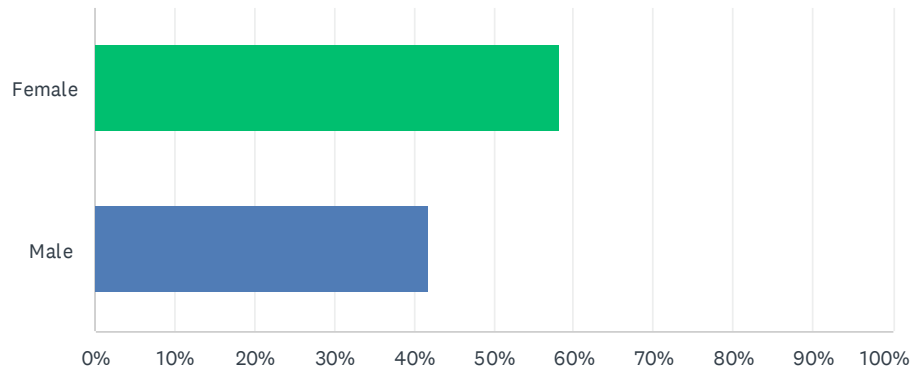

## Q13 Gender: How do you identify?

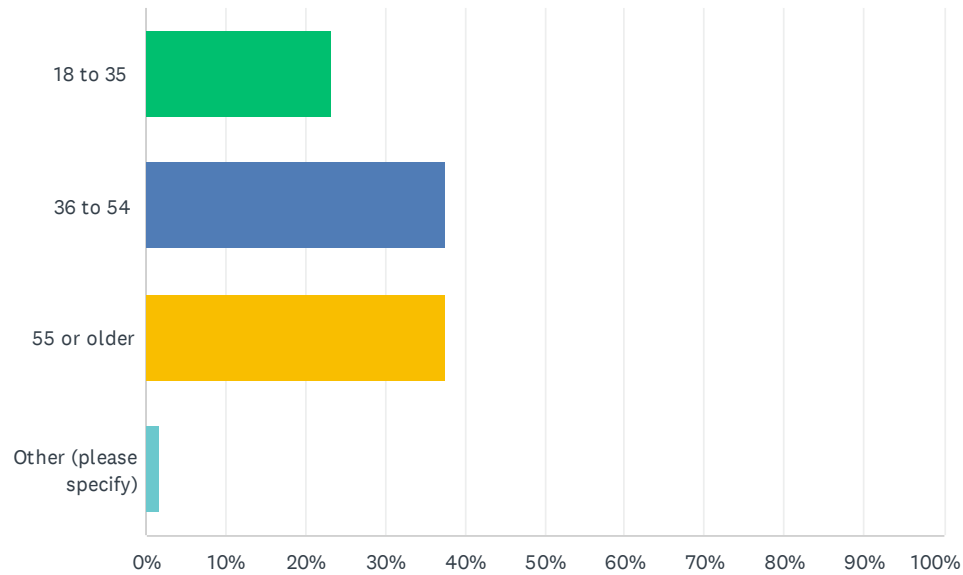

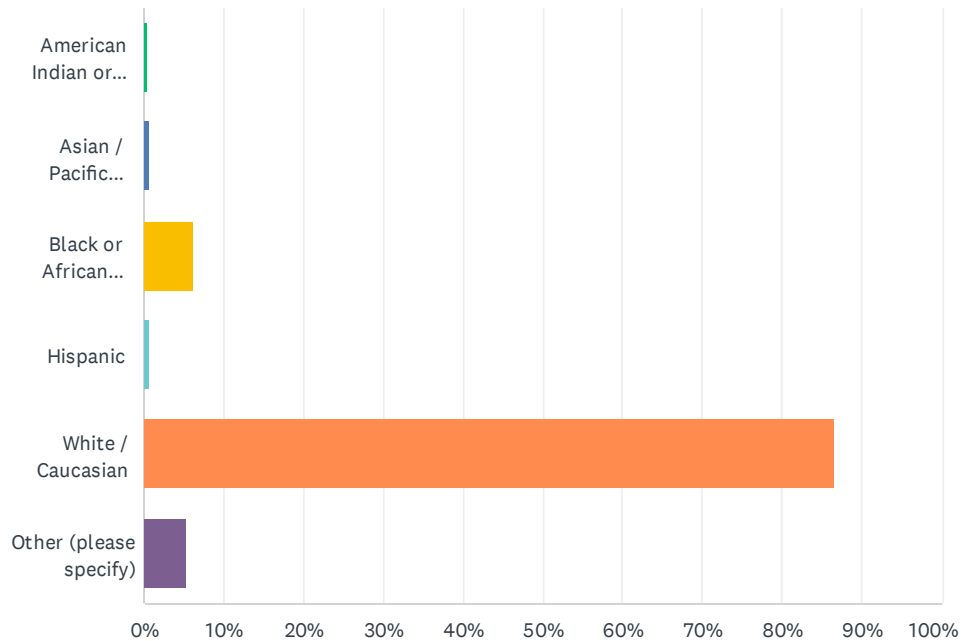

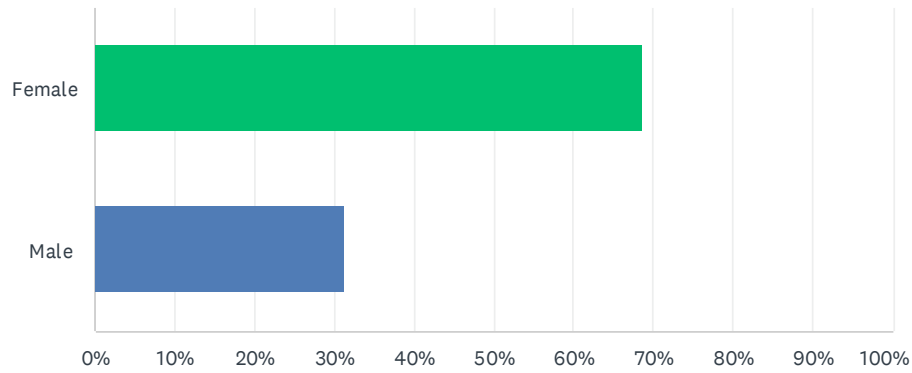

## Q18 Gender: How do you identify?

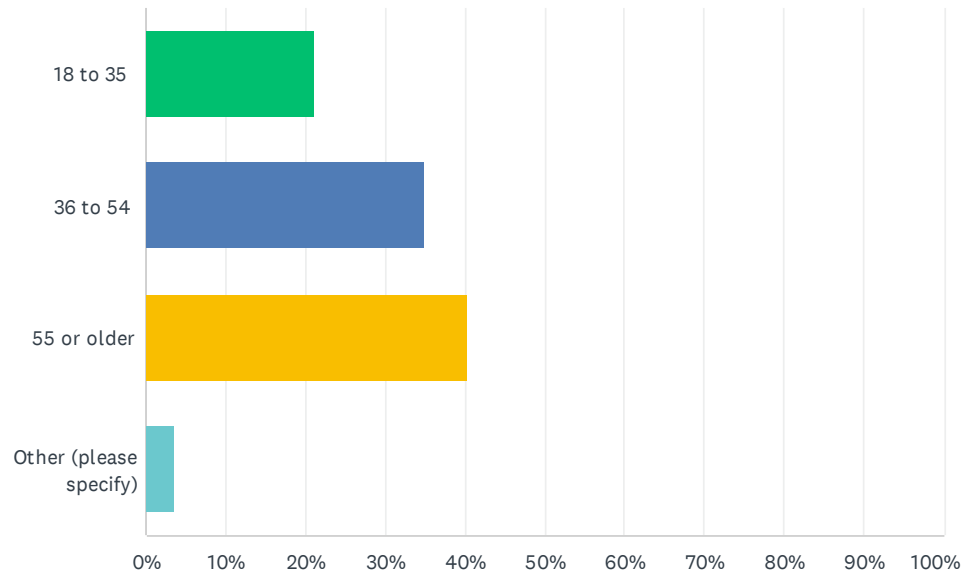
